Double Angle Race ~ Explanation for the "Amended Results"

On race day we used an unmodified class PHRF number for Lowly Worm of 150 which is the unmodified boat rating for a Moore 24. Unbeknownst to us, Lowly Worm's 2017 rating was pending and it was now modified with a bow sprit. I found out a few days after the race when the PHRF Committee was contacted to start the review process. Remembering the finish was very close, I recalculated and determined Merlin was actually the winner and Lowly Worm was second. I contacted Janice and she processed the change notifications to all the appropriate parties. As far as I know, the changes were accepted by everyone with a "good sport" attitude. Mr. Bill Lee wrote: "Thank you for the nice note and following up on the handicaps. The first place trophy is beautiful." As the saying goes, "an error is only a mistake if it goes uncorrected...."

VEEDER CUP REPORT

For those unfamiliar with the Veeder Cup, it is an annual race held on Monterey Bay for each of the four clubs to compete directly against each other. The boats are one-design, placing the emphasis on sailing skill. In years past, Santana 22's were used since each of the Monterey Bay clubs had a competitive S22 available. In recent years, that has changed and the boat of choice has changed to Santa Cruz 52's. Big difference! Since there are no SC52's in the Stillwater YC or EYC fleets, a sole representative is required to sail on one of each of the competing boats to meet the Cup "Deed Of Trust" requirement. This year, I was the EYC Rep sailing on SCYC's Elyxir, and Stillwater had a young man to sail on MPYC's Lucky Duck. Since the MPYC is the current holder of the Cup, the event was held in Monterey on Sunday and Monday of the Labor Day weekend.

The format is a five race series, each consisting of a four-mile course with two one-mile upwind and two one-mile downwind legs. First boat to win three races takes the cup for a year. Since Elyxir's mast is about 4 feet taller than Lucky Duck's, and agreed handicap of -3.5 seconds per mile was levied on Elyxir. So, when crossing the line first on Elyxir we needed to count to 15 before knowing if we had won.

Sunday's race one was in relatively light wind at the start and tapering off at the end. This gave Elyxir the advantage with the taller mast and extra sail area. We were able to reach the top mark sooner and on the second

trip round, Lucky Duck struggled to round the top mark and tried an in-shore route to the finish that did not pay off. Elyxir 1, Luck Duck 0. The second race was much different as the wind freshened for a better race. Elyxir lead round the top mark, but as we hoisted the chute, there were a few minor twists at the Tack. This distraction caused some loss of focus and an uncoordinated Spinnaker take down at the bottom mark. This allowed Lucky Duck to get inside nearer the mark and even with Elyxir at the rounding. On Elyxir, the call for the sail change came late and a brief moment of chaos on the foredeck. That allowed the "Duck" to get away, leveling the score to 1 win apiece.

Monday the wind was almost non-existent and we settled in for a long day for the drift-fest. At the start for race one, the afterguard called for a split. Lucky Duck went toward shore, while we went towards off-shore. It was a bad decision and Luck Duck took a decisive win and series advantage 2 to 1. The second race we learned that splitting was not a good idea and stayed right with Luck Duck around the course. The Elyxir was able to get on top of "the Duck" and hold the advantage all the way to the finish. Score now even at 2 wins each. At this point, the day was getting late and many of the crew need to go to work the next day. Both Skippers agreed to forego the fifth race as the prospect of any decent wind appearing as the sunset seemed very unlikely. Therefore, the final result was a tie. Since MPYC is the current cup holder, the Cup remains at the MPYC for another year.

OFFICE AND LOCKERS WAITLIST GUIDE

The Elkhorn Yacht Club has offices and lockers of varying square footages for rent to any Club Members on a monthly and quarterly rental basis. When, or if, all the Units are occupied there will be a "Wait List" maintained by the Club Manager for consideration, should a Unit become available.

Below is the method for which the Wait List is managed:

- * The Wait List will be maintained by the Club Manager.
- * Any Member in good standing may request to have their name placed on the Wait List
- * Any Member request for an office or locker Unit must be by email or in written form and include: Member's name, phone number, the office or locker request, or the special request and the date.
- * The Club Manager will acknowledge the Members name and the date the request was received.
- * The Wait List will contain a space for a "specific unit" request. If a Member is *only* interested in a particular Unit, then that shall be noted on the Wait List.
- * A Specific Unit request is a "special request" that restricts the Members ability to be notified of all other available Units based on a particularly chosen Unit. There may be multiple names waiting on a "special request" Unit at any given time.
- * When a Unit becomes available the Members whose name is at the top of the list will be asked if they wish to take that Unit. If they do not wish to take that Unit, then it will be offered to the next person on the list. And so on down the list.
- * No Member may substitute their position on the Wait List.
- * Trading or Subletting of Units is strictly prohibited. If this occurs, the tenant(s) may be asked to vacate the Unit immediately.
- * As stated in the existing Rental Agreement there will be no subletting of a Unit.
- * There shall be no sharing of a Unit without the approval of the Club Manager whereby the Member who is sharing the Unit shall also sign the Rental Agreement.
- * A Member tenant can not promise a Unit to another Member. The names on the Wait List will prevail.

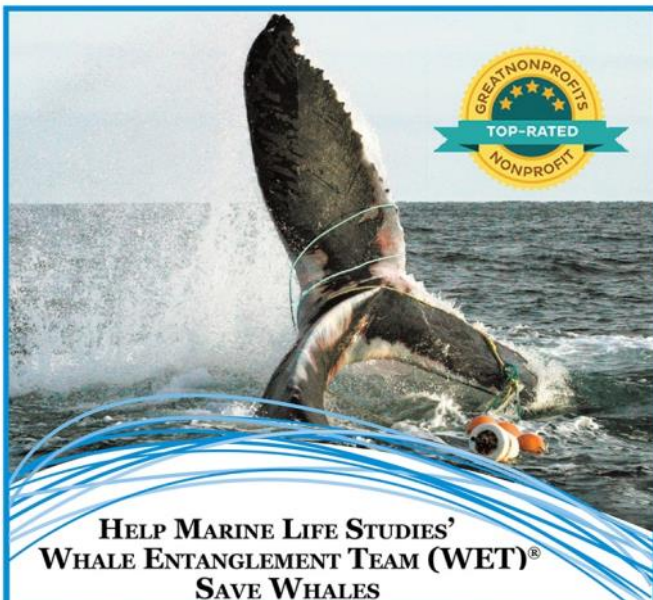
