



On Saturday, November 9, Yacht Club is the work party completed the last section of the seawall project. The last channel. nut, bolt and screw was stalled in place.

So we are good to go for the next 26 years. Many of the younger members of the work parties will be available for the next upgrade.

After COVID, concerns were

raised regarding the extensive rotting of the existing whaler supporting the seawall. A group of members got together and made contact with the engineer of the original seawall construction. Plans were prepared and materials purchased. Work was started in September 2023.

The county stopped work on the wall In October 2023. Plans submitted for permit in January 2024 and finally approved in late April 2024. Work parties then continued and the work completed on the above date



SAILING NEWS CHOWDER CUP #4 (Nov. 9)

our boats came out for Chowder Cup #4 which featured a course set by Jim Brady. Several crew showed up looking for boats to sail on and were distributed across the fleet. The weather was beautiful skies and fair seas. Winds that were predicted to be light, and for most of the race exceeded expectations. While Mariko crossed the start line last, they soon made up for that error. Northern Light chased Aquanaut to try and push her out around the first mark, but at the last moment Aquanaut played an excellent maneuver that gave her rights and sent Northern Light scrambling to find wind and make its way around the mark significantly behind. As the fleet headed for the second mark at ML-2, the winds were still keeping up and we decided to execute the full race rather than a shortened course option. By the time Mariko rounded the last mark before the finish she was well ahead of everyone and crossed the line before Northern Light rounded the last mark behind Aquanaut. Solace crossed the line second, and due to some spinnaker-set issues, Northern Light managed to beat Aquanaut across the line. Corrected-times resulted in a clear win by Mariko, Solace Second, Aquanaut third, and Northern Light last. All in all, a fabulous day sailing and some good friendly competition. Congratulations to the skippers and crews.

Finally, a huge thanks to Bill and Andrew for taking on the dishwasher and cleanup crew!
















EYC'ERS OUT & ABOUT MELISSA'S FIRST SAIL!
